### Health Insurance Marketplace

The Health Insurance Marketplace offers one-stop shopping for health insurance plans. The plans offer good coverage and most people qualify for discounts. In 2021, more than 215,000 Missourians enrolled in insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace. Nearly 85% of them qualified for discounts on their insurance. If you haven't enrolled before, it's time to look again.

### Medicaid

Low-income Missourians can also get covered through Medicaid, also called MO HealthNet. MO HealthNet is our state's free health insurance program for people who can't afford to buy their own insurance. Thanks to the Medicaid Expansion passed by Missouri voters last year, more people than ever before can qualify for Medicaid. If you've applied in the past and have been told you don't qualify to get Medicaid in Missouri, it's time to try again.
